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INTRODUCTION

The *Graduating Senior Survey* has been administered at the University since Spring 2002. The instrument covers a wide variety of topics.

First, information about the general knowledge, skills, personal development and professional growth of the students is questioned. Second, perceptions regarding major and core courses, faculty, instruction, advising, facilities, campus services and opportunities, and the overall intellectual environment at UA are requested. Third, extracurricular information about participation in clubs and organizations, and one's work status throughout college is sought. Lastly, the students' job search and post-graduation plans, as well as their geographic employment preferences are queried. There is also

ample opportunity to expand upon a response with open-ended questions.

The Office of Institutional Research and Assessment (OIRA) is responsible for the administration, tabulation, and dissemination of the results. While the data disseminated after the first administration in May 2002 has proven to be quite valuable and insightful to many on campus there remains a concern about the response rate. The response rate for the initial May 2002

administration was 39%. The response rate afterwards, however, dropped substantially to a low of 22.5% for the 2005-06 academic year. OIRA continues to try and get the colleges, and even the departments and programs, more involved in encouraging their soon-to-be graduates to complete the instrument. The response rate increased to 32.2% for the 2009-10 academic year due to better and extra email notification techniques.



DATA COLLECTION & RESPONDENT CHARACTERISTICS

Data were collected using web-based submission. Students received email solicitations at the end of their last term or just after graduation. In total, 2,344 graduating undergraduate students completed the survey out of a total of 7,974 that graduated during the 2008-09 and 2009-10 academic years, for a combined 29.4% response rate.

Comparisons between the various demographic and academic categories revealed few peculiarities. Among the demographic categories the persistent bias towards female respondents continued, although it was less than in previous years. There were little differences among the racial/ethnic categories or by major college.


OMNIBUS SURVEY RESULTS

The results of the survey are provided at two levels in this report.

First, the omnibus results for all 2,344 respondents are given. Second, a breakdown of the data is provided for each of the eight academic colleges and schools at UA. Results broken down by department or major will be done only as requested.

The survey is reproduced in the writeup. Percentages of structured responses are reported in tables, while students' remarks to open-ended questions are listed and highlighted in *red italic text*. An ID number is provided each student to allow comparisons and context among their open-ended responses. For example, all open-ended responses for each number are given by the same graduating student. The number of respondents (N) for each structured item and those providing open-ended comments is given as well.

Open-ended comments are given only in the college write-ups.



Question 1: Student Identification

Students were asked to provide their Campuswide ID. This was done to ensure that only graduating seniors were analyzed, and to be able to link to data in the student information system.

SURVEY RESULTS OMNIBUS REPORT

Respondent Characteristics

Two thousand three hundred and forty-four of 7,974 graduating students (29.4%) from The University of Alabama completed the instrument during the 2008-09 and 2009-10 academic years. One thousand four hundred and thirteen respondents were female (60.3%), 931 were male. Two thousand and forty respondents were White (87.0%), 209 were African-American (8.9%), 64 were Hispanic (2.7%), 13 were Asian-American (0.6%), 10 were Non-resident Aliens (0.4%), seven were Native-American (0.3%), and one was unknown. Nine hundred and seventy-one respondents graduated during the 2008-09 academic year, and 1,373 during the 2009-10 academic year.

SURVEY RESULTS COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

Respondent Characteristics

Six hundred and forty-one of 2,127 graduating students (30.1%) from the College of Arts and Sciences completed the instrument during the 2008-09 and 2009-10 academic years. Four hundred and seven respondents were female (63.5%), 234 were male. Five hundred and forty-five respondents were White (85.0%), 62 were African-American (9.7%), 27 were Hispanic (4.2%), three were Native-Americans (0.5%), two were Non-resident Aliens (0.3%), one was Asian-American (0.2%), and one was of unknown ethnicity. Two hundred and sixty-six respondents graduated during the 2008-09 academic year, and 375 during the 2009-10 academic year.

4 I completed some of my core requirements through AP credit but the core courses I took at UA were satisfactory.

7 I wish The teachers would have been more informative about career choices and helping students to become involved in clubs.

9 Core is sometimes looked over a little because it is something general that everyone has to take. Even the teachers sometimes do not take it seriously.

11 I took some core classes elsewhere, but I had good experience in my core classes here.

13 The advising within the art department is extremely poor. I had to map out my own classes that I needed to take. The lack of instruction in advising caused me to add an extra semester onto my undergraduate career- a semester I could have spent as a graduate student. My advisor and professor, Tom Barnes, told me I was required to take certain classes that actually counted as electives, and if I had not figured this out on my own, I would have taken even more hours as electives. He also did not inform me which upper-level courses require prerequisites, and looked at me like I was ignorant when I discovered this fact myself. I had to tailor my education to a certain concentration - graphic design - in order to graduate in 4 1/2 years with a minor concentration in painting, and if I had not done this, it would have taken me 5 1/2 years to graduate as a painting major. Because of the mess that had been created, I had to spend an hour with one of the advisors in Clark Hall, who had to help sort out which clas

25 BSC 114 and 116(Biology for majors) was very much a disappointment in my opinion. The professors I had for both those lectures immediately retired thereafter and I feel as if the replacements probably were better. I feel like I was kind of cheated by faculty that were in need of an earlier retirement. They were very much not in tune with our generation and made it very difficult in our transition to college.

26 I found teachers and TA's to be much more personable, involved, and interested in the academic success of their students in my business minor classes. There were some very good and involved teachers and TAs in my Biology major classes, but I had many teachers who were cold, unapproachable, and indifferent to their students' success. Also, students of C&BA are made

frequently aware of job opportunities in their field and information on future occupations is readily available. I found job preparation and occupational education beyond education significantly lacking in the Biology department.

32 I felt as if the instructors were not personable. A lot of them seemed to be involved more so in their research and other activities. I felt like certain students were their "pets". However, if I had not transferred and stated off at the university I may feel differently.

35 There were not a lot of options for Biology classes. I am attending Auburn University for graduate school in the fall, and I have noticed that they provide a vast amount of Biology courses not provided by UA.

46 English 102 was very helpful in learning how to write.

53 6a is only applicable to my British literature class. All my other core requirements were satisfied by the A. P. credit or the Blount Undergraduate Initiative.

73 I took most of my core while still in high school through a community college, but I did a fair amount of my core work at the University too.

77 Excellent!

88 I didn't have GTAs in my core courses.

92 I did not have a GTA in any core level course.

96 In the core classes that I completed at UA, I felt that the faculty and GTA's (when we even knew we had one) could have been a little better, resulting in better scores for not only myself, but for classmates as well.

99 I learned a lot at The University of Alabama.

125 criminal justice and sociology is a great major and the professors are amazing and they care about their students and the progress and success that they make while they are at the university of alabama and beyond. ROLL TIDE!

137 Cornelius Carter is a horrible director for any kind of program. He just likes to hear himself talk.

143 It was a long time ago, so I don't really remember much of my core classes.

144 It's great to see that the teachers here care about a student's academic success. However, I strongly encourage them, in all departments, to apply the lessons in their syllabi to everyday life while they account for the needs of every student. They need to answer the question of why students should care about the lessons. They must find ways to reach out and/or relate to the students while teaching them. My best instructors were the best communicators- regardless of the department. I also implore instructors everywhere to avoid the common mistake of "regurgitation," that is to say, testing students to see whether they recall the talking points the previous week. Students need to go more in depth while they learn a subject than just by taking notes and spitting the information back out onto a multiple choice test, hoping to get an A for their "troubles." Faculty working together as a group is a great start. Use these comments as you wish.

150 Core curriculum felt weak, with a few exceptions instructors weren't very involved - treated classes as necessary but overall unimportant.

154 Going to Clark Hall for advising, applying to graduate, etc. was a nightmare. Almost everyone that works there is just rude and minimally helpful. Clark Hall makes a lot of people reconsider being an Arts and Science major.

155 I didn't take many core classes. At the moment, I can't remember more than two that I had to take.

169 I wish I could have taken upper level classes directly to fulfill core requirements rather than being limited to 100 level classes. I have broad interests and value courses beyond my majors, but too often my choices were limited to 100 level classes, which I found to be consistently oriented towards teaching to lowest common denominator and were frequently my least beneficial or enjoyable classes. Access to higher level courses without prereqs could have allowed me to take more interesting and challenging classes for my general ed requirements.

170 I am double majoring, so this information is for the ENGLISH Department, not Political Science.

171 These professors were almost always extremely vivacious, and enthusiastic about their subject; frequently to an infectious level

179 The classes taken for the core requirements were incredibly easy. I feel as if very little effort is made to teach or prepare the student for anything other than the test. I felt as if everyone

was just pushed through in order to complete the course. Also, Dr. Janis Edwards in the communications studies department was the worst teacher I have had during my entire academic career. She is grossly unqualified to be a professor and does not respect her students. I hate to single out a specific faculty member but I feel compelled to say something here. The course evaluations don't seem to be effective.

195 I took all my cores at Shelton, which was wonderful.

200 A number of history professors have served as serious people of inspiration, particularly Dr. Schwab, Dr. Huebner, and Dr. Beeler.

206 The faculty in the History Dept. were excellent and took an active role in my life. I was more than a number to them. My last two years as a history major was more fulfilling than my first two years as a biology major where the advisors and professors took NO interest in me or my goals, even when I sought direction. UA's faculty in the History department changed my life. TenHoor could use an overhaul. The building stinks and it is cold in the winter time. Other buildings, where all the money is, like the Science and Business school are in mint condition. Money needs to be put in TenHoor, afterall, every student will go through that building for degree requirements for humanities. It needs updating and repairs. Thank you.

210 Faculty here was very helpful and contributed to my academic success that i have achieved thus far.

226 I did not fill 6a out in regard to the New College staff. Everything in their lists would be frequently and excellent. I filled it out for the Arts and Sciences core classes that I had to take such as english, history, etc.

229 The curriculum in New College is excellent. In the business school, the classes are good, but there is very little instruction on public speaking and grammatical instructions.

231 New College faculty are wonderful

239 I felt the education level in the core curriculum courses was very good overall. However, I felt some of the science labs were often a waste of time. I also took Math 112 at Shelton State specifically because they actually taught the math and it wasn't all done on a computer (I took this course summer of 2009). We used MyMathLab in conjunction with classroom study, but it did not replace the actual teacher. I ended up doing very well in the class (95%) however, I feel, had I taken it at UA (due to what some of my fellow classmates and friends said), I would've done very poorly. Strict computer learning should NEVER replace the teacher in any course, and it seems that is what UA has done for basic Math courses. Sometimes I felt overall that there was too much emphasis on using expensive technology that didn't actually equal to better performance from students and it seemed to tax our pockets too much as well. Also, foreign language study, especially in the beginning, should be focused more on conversati

240 Dr.S Bunker, Dr. J Hill, and Dr. S Schwabb are the BEST!!!

241 I rarely had full professors before spring 2009. There were some GREAT teachers, but there were definitely POOR ones as well. The good outweighed the bad overall, but I felt significantly unprepared for the workforce when I graduated. I complained about the quality of advising more than once, and was once turned away from the Arts and Sciences advisors because I had already declared my major. I had to email Ann Webb and request permission to meet with an advisor, which is not the treatment I was promised when recruited by the Honors College. The Honors College and French department really saved my UA experience as far as my studies were concerned.

242 unless you hounded a specific instructor to give you feedback or take you under their wing then they were not nurturing in the slightest. the undergraduate required english classes were a joke. after switching to honors level then they became what the regular level, required english courses should have been. this might be why most seniors here are still scared/ unable to write a paper. most students actually receive very little help from advising because they advisers treat it as an inconvenience and make it very impersonal. most lectures in any 100, 200 and in the business school 300 (mgt 395 and mkt 300 the biggest offenders), level classes are afterthoughts. they mainly consist of the powerpoints made for the text book and are a waste of time. there should be more supplemental material or at least 'war stories' from the professors. the classroom setting and the lecture style of most 100, 200 and some 300 level courses are impersonal, boring and seen as a waste of time by students (and some professors

247 I was very unhappy with my major advising. I also felt that the International Studies program wasn't regimented enough to give a solid background for future employment or study.

261 Microbiology is always full and the teacher always has to allow more students in. I think they should just create a second class.

267 It was very hard to take the core classes I wanted due to class conflicts with my major-related required classes.

268 Many of my core credits were received through enrollment in honors courses, which differ significantly from my non-honors experience. Questions about honors courses would mostly be answered "excellent" whereas the questions as applied to non-honors courses would mostly fall under "seldom."

269 My experience with core classes (the introductory courses) was varied. The UH and advanced courses were great because of the small class size, students that actually wanted to learn, and excited professors that enjoyed teaching students who want to learn. My language (French) and computer science classes were also great. English and writing fell under the UH/advanced category, and mathematics, physics, and psychology came easily to me to begin with. My problems were the history and chemistry classes. Because of the large size, there were many students who really didn't want to be there. Also, professors usually taught from powerpoint slides that they did not put together themselves. I have the most complaints about the chemistry classes, where the professors actually tell you that only 1/3 of the original (101) class will make it to the 102 class. I had to take 102 my senior year because it never fit into my schedule. This course consists of a 50 minute lecture three times a week, an 80 minute recitation one

274 The core curriculum desperately needs to be reduced. I was unable to take many upper-level classes because of the core requirements, and am now at a significant disadvantage as an entering graduate student.

276 Half of my core was at UA

277 I took my core classes at a community college, but one problem I do see is the amount of people in classes. If there are too many people the students feel disconnected.

281 History department using of electronic clicking device in lecture seems not very good for some students because it demands IMMEDIATE response which unfair to some non-english speaker students

284 As I took more higher level classes faculty cared more and more in Political Science. In Classics the faculty really took an interest in me and my academic progress from the start. I think that this was because it was a smaller department.

285 As a general blanket statement, core curriculum teachers from my experience were more focused not so much on the material but how you process that material. Few of my major teaches took that approach, but that is probably due to the assumption that students had already aquired those skills in lower level classes. One other thing to consider in evaluating my responses is that in my opinion, my high school was harder than my lower level classes. The hardest thing about lower level classes in college was making it to class. For example, my freshman year I took physics as a pre-political science major. In that class, the class used the exact same textbook that I had used in my AP Physics class in high school.

292 Textbooks did not always correlate with tests or lecture material

298 Core curriculum courses could have been taught by anyone. Most GTA's just follow what's in the book like a high school course--memorizing terms for tests and regurgitating theories and facts from our readings. Basically, there is not much application or critical thinking in core classes.

307 Most of those teachers just wanted to get through the class. They weren't worried about the students as individuals for the most part.

321 Obtained greater interest from faculty in HDFS, my minor, than Psychology major.

323 A lot of the time, the coursework in my core classes seemed more like "busy work", I didn't enjoy my classes until upper level.

325 Most of the time I felt like the graduate students were better teachers than some of the faculty. They seem to be more energetic and use more up to date technology than some of the older faculty members.

328 The faculty is great. I never had a problem and I got to know all of my teachers very well. They were always helpful.

329 Some core teachers were excellent...others, not so much.

346 My minor is Human Development and although many teachers i was not impressed with Vicki Peeples an excellent teacher and challenged myself and classmates more than any teacher I've had at UA. She has a perfect balance between excitement for what she is teaching and high expectations!

352 I would to see faculty more involved in the academic and personal concerns of the students so that they will be equipped with some knowledge and sense of direction for plans after graduation.

358 In many of the lower level core class like chemistry, biology, ect. the student to teacher ratios are terrible. I feel this lowers the quality of the lecture and definitely hinders access to the instructors and even the TAs, leaving students mostly on their own.

362 The smallness of my major's department really attributed to its ability to "look after" me as I went through college. If it wasn't for my major's department, I would not have had such a positive experience here on campus. I am not saying that it couldn't have been good, but because of my department it was great.

363 I can't quite make sense of how an undergraduate humanities department could take for granted that critical thinking, the very practice of interrogating the meaning-structures human life and society is embedded in, isn't something that should take place on a first-order basis in intro-level classrooms, not just Philosophy classrooms (and, not that PHL 104 actually teaches the practice of critical thinking, but rather the systematic philosophic approach to interpreting syllogisms). And I think it would be readily assumed that if this were to actually be a class (and some classes in REL do come close on occasion), it'd fall somewhere in the 400-level seminars which to me, if anything, serves as more of an insult to the idea rather than a step forward. The very ghettoization of ideas--exercising stray thoughts in an upper-room of the fringes of academia. In my opinion, and as someone who would like to make contributions to her alma mater throughout her career, I think it would be important to see UA step up

368 Some of the classes were large and impersonal and so they were often a take notes and regurgitate it back type of class with critical thinking skills hardly ever emphasized.

370 I feel some of the tenured teachers have become lazy because they know no one checks up on them. It is the 21st Century, it is time to take out the old and in with the new!!!!!!!

374 I had a few really good professor but most were horrible in the general education classes.

376 Core was fun simply because I planned my schedule out so far in advance that I could disperse it throughout my entire time at UA. I am many other people, use these classes simply to offset our upper divisions so we do not have to do as much work. honestly it is a really poor system and idea.

381 As a senior, I am taking several 100 and 200 level electives I needed for graduation. After having professors that cared in upper-level classes, I am miserable in the intro classes. I think it may be my grad students as instructors, but they change their mind constantly, can't keep to a syllabus, never cover the correct material, and overall have no clue what they are doing!

385 For the most part, I enjoyed my core courses. The only thing I hated was MATH100 and MATH110. I don't really like the online system and I feel like the professors didn't care at all if you passed or failed. I know several people that had to take MATH110 and other courses in math up to three times.

403 This isn't about my core courses, but I don't know if I'm going to get the opportunity to complain about it. The computer lab in Woods 211 is not big enough for the demand of students that want in. I was delayed in getting started in Graphic Design by a couple of semesters because of this. Graphic Design is a growing field, and UA needs to adjust its facilities to keep up. I don't feel ready to go into the workforce, not because of the teachers, but because i don't feel that i had the time to take more classes in different areas of digital media.

415 Faculty know they are required courses and act differently than major courses, which is where they assume we would rather be.

422 Advising in the Biology department was quite poor and actually just involved getting a signature. Help was not an option really.

423 Some of the core courses in the biology major were so large that it was made the class more difficult to receive feedback or individualized attention.

427 The section of courses is not that great sometime, so you end up taking classes you aren't interested in.

428 Poor advising!

430 I really enjoyed being able to take my core classes, such as history, during the evening and only one day a week. The classes were much smaller and more interactive. Also, I enjoyed the option of being able choose either computer science or foreign language because it allowed me to apply my foreign language minor toward my core classes.

453 The Criminal Justice faculty are very respectful, intelligent, caring and welcoming. They have helped out very much towards my academic completion.

459 The criminal justice program is nothing more than a sociology degree, that in truth has done little or nothing to prepare me for actual law enforcement jobs, in addition, Farrah Hall is in ill repair, and we at least deserve a decent computer lab and wireless internet. Or maybe we don't.

466 It was for the most part pretty good, outside of the physics department.

467 I transferred from southern union state community college so my core classes where not taken here. but i'm sure you guys are doing a fine job:)

468 101 classes should be at a 101 level. I am obviously a senior and have a D in a 101 class. I shouldn't be worried about graduation because of a D in a 101 class.

474 It is kind of hard for me to remember what a lot of my core courses were like. This part a survey may be better given to a beginning of the year junior or senior.

475 My only major problem here at the university was with advising. I rarely got a straight answer to any of my problems. Frequently, I was refered to someone else who refered me to someone else etc. until I finally would meet with someone who would tell me something entirely different from the questions I was asking to begin with. I feel like that, because of this poor advising, I had to attend this university for longer than I would have normally had to in order to accomplish my degree. I realize that this institution is all about making money, but you are taking advantage of people, and that is wrong.

487 I took most of my core curriculum at another school.

488 The core classes at the university are severely lacking in both faculty and level of difficulty. I find it difficult to even remember these professors names, as the classes were so large and there was so little actual student/faculty involvement. Generally, in these courses, I found myself taking a step backward from my high school courses.

489 I believe the level of faculty assistance for students not pursing graduate school is not where it should be. I have received no help in acquiring a job from this University.

497 I had honors priority registration, hence the reason why I usually always got the classes I wanted, unless I changed my mind. I know many students who had problems getting their required courses, however.

504 I feel much more connected to my major curriculum courses and faculty then i do to that of my core curriculum.

508 I am a transfer student. There was a misunderstanding of the amount of hours required for my core classes. I think all incoming students, incoming or transfer, should be clearly instructed on what is required of them for graduation.

517 I really wish the University would put more into buildings like ten Hoor. It was frustrating to walk into a room with desks that were not in the best of shape. Why did it take so long to get new ones?

522 I cannot speak highly enough of all of the New College faculty and staff.

523 So little is required for the grade, many are happy just to regurgitate what's necessary. These classes tend to be monotonous, and rather brain-numbing.

531 Being a distance education student without adequate feedback gave me a sense of isolation from the larger academic community. I did not feel that there was any special interest in my academic progress of lack thereof from "instructors."

532 The EXD staff and my advisor, Ana Schuber were beyond outstanding

535 I was enrolled in the EXD program and found that I learned more and had more advanced education through this department and the classes offered than any traditional classroom I have been in.

540 Some of the courses I took here at UA were an absolute joke. The professors in 3+ classes I had just GAVE students the answers to the exams. These classes were some of the most infuriating experiences I've encountered at UA and are an embarrassment to the university and those receiving their degrees from this establishment. This is college not kindergarten, and the professors in 300 level courses need to know when to stop babying their students and being so desperate for a good grade on www.ratemyprofessor.com

556 Core courses may benefit from more oral presentations especially if students are continuing on to a graduate degree.

557 I took honors literature and history courses, which were all well taught. I did not like the format of the Sociology course (SOC 101) because it was taught solely by a GTA and the online work was not conducive to sufficiently learning the material.

560 Some of my core classes were taken at another institution, but not all of them. Of the cores I took, I think Intro to Listening was the best. The professor really wanted all of her students to appreciate music and I learned quite a bit from the course. I now know when there is a percussion drum playing in the background of a song. She started off using powerpoint, but once the powerpoint broke and she was writing on the board, the class was much easier to follow and understand. She also opened our (the students as a whole) eyes to music performances at Moody and I hope there will be more teachers like her to come at UA.

561 The CH dept. is full of excellent professors. I haven't seen anything else like it.

566 GTAs are often immature and unprofessional. I never quite understood why we pay money to have a 22 year old person with no teaching experience try to teach us anything. In general, faculty at the core level is good. Sometimes it's excellent, sometimes it's adequate, and sometimes it's quite bad. A few instructors I found to be very good were Sam Evers in introductory mathematics and Cori Perdue in Literature (though I feel that the Lit. curriculum simply involves too much work). Sorry for naming names, but I only named the ones that I have a high opinion of.

568 I didn't take many cores because of AP testing. No natural sciences, history sequence, or freshman comp.

571 I had a GTA in Political Science that told us he would help us flip a school bus and set it on fire. I reported it to the department chair, and he is still "teaching." It was the most ridiculous class I took at UA. I made an A on the midterm paper and an A on the project. That was supposed to be 100% of the class grade, but somehow I made a B- in the class. Might want to check into that one. His name is Juan Black.

577 Classes in upper level were full for Political Science and it was a rat-race to get into the right classes. Not one upper level class I took had less than 45 people, quite a disappointment.

584 Took core somewhere else.

591 I was able to work most of my core coursework into my major; I rarely had GTAs or otherwise.

[Comment on libraries, (7): PLEASE ADD ADDITIONAL OUTLETS AT GORGAS LIBRARY. I FIND IT ABHORRENT THAT I NEED TO BRING AN EXTENSION CORD TO THE LIBRARY EVERY TIME I VISIT IF I WANT TO HAVE A CHANCE AT KEEPING MY COMPUTER CHARGED.]

600 It seems in some core classes that the faculty are unexcited to be there (specifically when you have a PhD teaching them) because they feel that it is beneath them. Math and science classes especially. This could be due to the large number of students in these classes; however, feeling as though just because you aren't majoring in a certain subject that you aren't as worthy of an instructor's time as a major student in that area is wholly unacceptable at this level of academia.

603 A graduate teaching assistant, George Karatheodoris, taught one of my physics courses (PH105). He was very unprofessional and rarely showed up to Friday class. In addition, he scheduled a study session for the week before final exams and failed to show up. I showed up to the study session only to find a note on the door stating that the session had been cancelled due to "extended Cinco de Mayo celebrations." He also did not follow the agreements on grading set forth in the syllabus. His class was the worst I have had at the University of Alabama. I recommend that graduate teaching assistants not be the sole professor for core courses and that the College of Arts and Sciences look seriously at ways to improve the Physics Department.

607 I do not think professors make good advisors: they knew less than I did about applying to classes and major requirements. I would ask questions and have to sneak into the Arts and Sciences advisors' office to ask questions about classes.

616 *The arts and science department does not help in guiding students when registering for core classes.*

625 *All professors that i have had at the University of Alabama were great in all areas of their job. I only had one GTA that i thought was a good teacher, the rest were not.*

635 *Core classes were too large, and the faculty didn't seem to really care.*

636 *I only took two English classes and a math class as core. My first English was very well-taught by a GTA. The other two classes were taught by faculty, who were as disinterested in lower-level classes as could be.*

637 *I do not include the Blount Program courses I took as a part of my vore curriculum.*

Teaching in this program was excellent. I learned more through the few Blount classes I took than any of my other classes, to include my major.

639 *There is a large communication gap between Arts and Sciences advisers and individual department advisers. Specifically in dealing with honors undergraduate programs, such as Blount, and clearly outlining the delegation of hours to credits*

261 The student health center takes hours to get into and they doctors prescribe antibiotics no matter what the problem is.

269 The only request from this section would be more healthy options in the food court. I don't want to pay \$9 for lunch to get something healthy from Fresh Food.

271 Campus food quality is excellent, but limitations on meal plan options in Ferg are disappointing, and food is not reasonably priced. \$8 lunch combos seem to exploit student accounts too much.

11 *I have met many very incredible and intelligent instructors and fellow students at this university, but I have met many narrow-minded, unpleasant people as well. These students complain about reasonable coursework and are not prepared for a collegiate intellectual environment.

150 All of the tenured professors in my major were very impressive but I did not feel very intellectually involved until my last few semesters.

167 The campus as a whole is booming and growing intellectually. Sure, there are some areas that seem to be in decline, but you can't have a perfect situation. As a whole, the intellectual environment at UA is something to be proud of.

168 Clear emphasis on learning, but one must assess the whole in this case as an average of its parts, and a sizable portion of the student body is simply more interested in parties than learning.

169 The intellectual environment can be strong at UA, but I had to find these niche environments and go out of my way to challenge myself intellectually. 178 It is a strong suggestion to participate in laboratory work as well as forming ones own hypotheses and creating knowledge.

179 The majority of the student population does not seem to care about the intellectual growth. Most students here appear to do just enough to get by and never pursue their own personal growth academically. There is a small community of students who enjoy their courses and want to learn, but these students are the minority.

180 The intellectual environment is improving. It's reputation as a great college has gotten stronger since I've been here.

181 I think there are people who are here to learn from and challenge one another, but there are also people who are here just to be here and I think that can detract from the learning experience. But overall I think there are more people here working hard that really contribute to the intellectual environment here at UA.

232 I participated in New College which allowed me to research my own passions and develop as an individual.

235 My on-campus classroom experiences are limited, but those that I participated in were very stimulating and thought provoking, even though they were short in duration.

236 Compared to my children's experiences at other schools

239 Overall, the education I have received has been very good or excellent, depending on the class and Professor. I have few complaints about the education itself and I can honestly say that I have taken away something important from every class I ever took, even from classes I took a few years ago. Every class has added to my knowledge and I have improved as a person because of it. Since coming to UA, my knowledge has vastly improved in various subjects and areas, I have learned more about myself, increased my academic confidence as well as organization and leadership. Overall, my time here has been extraordinarily valuable and the intellectual environment added immensely to that.

240 Simple...the professors know what they are talking about, and can answer questions on a topic from a variety of angles.

241 In such a heavily lopsided state (politically), it's very easy for those with different ideas, opinions, or lifestyles to feel isolated. UA tried very hard to be accepting of these differences in public, but most of the students who found themselves outside of the mainstream opinions and lifestyles took their collaborations nearly underground. For UA's efforts to make these students feel welcome, I gave the average instead of weak.

242 there are stars in every department and all of the resources and tools are here. most 300 level and up professors are saints and i wonder why they're here with such outstanding credentials. however, professors and the university do not do a sub-par job of motivating the students and stressing how important their education is here (beyond extra curricular activities and sporting events). it will take some time for the school to shake its greek, party image. i am affiliated with the greek program and the vast majority do not take their education seriously and are even boisterous in classroom settings (in addition to excessive cheating, especially in the business school). since 2005, when i came to ua, this has vastly improved but we have a long way to go.

244 The professors and some of the students contribute greatly to the academic environment. However, I feel that I have encountered too many students that are not interested in learning and contributing to the academic environment.

245 There are extremes at Alabama. Some care very strongly about academics and intellect while another large group doesn't emphasize academics. If you are a devoted student, you can associate yourself with the group that cares, but the presence of those that don't care about school is still ever present.

246 Most classes I took had a strong intellectual environment because I took honors classes and was in the Blount Program. I would say that classes outside of those are less intellectual.

247 The quality of classroom lectures ranges from very poor to very good, depending on the instructor. Outside of the classroom, I haven't found much of a stimulating academic environment. Classes seem more like a means to an end.

248 students and faculty are willing to work together and learn together

249 Much of education is about teaching yourself-- about having the initiative and drive to learn more everyday. 267 The student population as a whole seems to have a "class is a second priority" kind of attitude. Football has to do with that, but I believe there could be more encouragement to go to class. It does wonders to hear from respectable people lines of encouragement - not making someone, but kindly encouraging. Though dates and names are a part of history, that "history is evaluating and substantiating an argument" to quote one of my professors is a clear example that some of the faculty was to make sure that with the degree that we earn, we also learn how to think for ourselves. Students should come to the University of Alabama mostly for the education that they will receive. I love football, but my education is more important. There should be more of a focus on learning and not winning. I also think that replacing flowers every week and ongoing construction is a waste of money. More money should be spent helping students to get the best education possible. I pay more than \$7000 a year to attend this university and I think the least that the UA could do is allow print credits for students. I also think that the UA should consider where they are spending money and focus on a learning environment.

298 The professors seemed to know what they are talking about and can help students when they ask questions. Also, students seem to have access to many avenues of higher education--UHP, IHP, and clubs etc.

300 There were just a few times lacking

301 This university is definitely what you make of it. One can get a great education, or simply coast through.

302 I participated in numerous in-class discussions that challenged my views and forced me to develop reasoning skills when presenting an argument.

305 It depends on the class and the teacher, but I had more classes where the students were not motivated enough by the material to want to discuss it. The most intellectually stimulating classes were the honors courses that I participated in.

306 The diversity in opinion is not significantly strong but strong enough to challenge the thoughts in which a student had upon entering the university.

307 Most professors really know their subject and enjoy teaching it. A lot of students care very little, and that brings the teachers down.

309 Intelligent teachers, environments conducive to class discussion

311 The teachers were intellectual, but it seemed some students didn't know much.

312 We seem to be up to par with most other public state universities, so I would consider us average.

313 Sometimes the teachers were way to easy and I didn't feel challenged as much as I should have been

314 There is a good environment on campus and at the university libraries.

315 Because you are encouraged to perform at a high level

316 It's a big school with ranging levels of intelligence.

318 I've met some very intelligent individuals, but the culture of the area tends to have a negative influence on their ability to use that intelligence in a positive manner. But if I had to look at every course I've taken on campus, the intellectual environment of these courses as a whole would be only average, if that. Students in departments such as Religious Studies create a much more engaging intellectual environment, and I'm sure there are other departments such as this. If you've never sat in on a course with Dr. McCutcheon or Murphy in REL I highly recommend it.

321 Obvious mix between those who are in school for school, and those for Fraternity Row.

323 In my opinion, this question is fully dependent on the individual teachers of each course. Some of the teachers I had created extremely engaging intellectual environments (Mr. Kelley-PY101 and Abnormal, Dr. Schofield-HD101, Kathryn Picard-Bio lab teacher, Mrs. Taylor-ARH, Dr. Nancarrow-ARH, Dr. Kim Caldwell BIO114, Ms. Crookston-WS200, HY102-Mr. Boulton, HY101- Mr. Mixson, Mr. Riley-ENG209, Dr. O'Donnell-BSC315, Mr. Wegrzynowski-ARH253 & ART216, Dr. Brodsky-PY491, Mr. Hudnall (grad student teacher) Art110, Mrs. Remine-FR103, and Herb Reith-ART210).

324 I believe the intellectual atmosphere here on campus is that of strong performance, guidance, and relevance for/to the students. In whatever we, as students, choose to take part in there will be opportunities or chances to create opportunities on campus and throughout the community. Intellectual, in this sense, does not narrowly mean academia, but also all of the critical conceptions of the student body.

325 I feel like there is a good intellectual environment, but I also feel like the party atmosphere on campus interferes with it.

327 No matter what subject or topic you are wanting to learn more about there is always someone ready and willing to help.

328 Too many students they only care about increasing enrollment most of my teachers did not even care if I came to class

329 It's strong if that is what you choose to see. If you frequent the library or the coffee shops etc. the strong academic environment is apparent.

330 intellectual environment is strong, always room for improvement, but I think UA is headed in the right direction

331 Everyone is always thriving to learn. It's a very diverse atmosphere.

332 The individuals and/or faculty members that I encountered during my experience at Alabama made an academically sound, knowledgeable, and passionate (about their

work/field/field of study)impression that to me reflects significant intelligence and academic desire to be the best at whatever field they are undertaking.

333 I always learned something new in one of my classes from either a teacher or student.

334 Most of the people that I encountered during my undergraduate expereince were very eager to learn, and they studied to make good grades.

335 At my time at the University I felt as if the teachers cared about my success. I never felt cheated by any of my teachers and I was suprised to learn how much the teachers care about their students and their futures.

336 If a student takes the initiative, the resources are available at UA to have a world class education. However, the environment is so large that one can easily slip through the cracks and pass with minimal effort.

340 I believe it is average because I have found many people who are extremely interested in their academic achievement and work hard toward their intellectual pursuits. However, I have also known many who do not bother with their academics and simply continue going to this college for the opportunity to party and go to football games.

341 While the learning environment is not bad, there is not much emphasis on excelling, at least in the psychology department. I've had some good professors and some bad but only a few were truly intellectually stimulating

344 Lack of undergraduate research relative to similar institutions, and an overall apathy towards certain lower level classes.

345 it wasn't overly intellectual, there was still room for causal conversation on a lower level.

346 I was pretty involved and worked on an honors thesis, but it really depends on what the person makes of their time at UA.

348 After attending the University, I believe that it is a very prestigious institution. Although I have had many quality teachers here, some have not been concerned with students academic success

349 How would you elaborate on average?

350 I feeel like I recieved a quality education.

351 While some people think of Alabama as a party school, the great majority of the students here are here to learn. At any time during the day you can find people in the libraries. Plus we have the most National Merit Scholars in the country. We are demonstrating our academic prowess more and more these days.

353 The students at UA all seem to have one thing in mind, achievement. Each student seems to work hard to pursue their personal goaols.

354 The University was a wonderful experience for me. It gave me insight for my self, my education, and my future goals. It has made me who I am today.

355 It appeared to me, on many occasions, that instructors would water down material to help those that would otherwise be unable to comprehend the material.

356 The faculty in the Psychology Department were always helpful, but after working in a few research labs I felt very strongly that some areas of the department lacked motivation and necessary funding. Also, I felt that many times students were passed through a class when they had not demonstrated competency, myself included. I would rather have had to repeat a class than just be pushed through along with other students who were going to get a degree they hadn't necessarily earned.

357 Some teachers challenge students to think outside of the box yet some do not. This is something that is not consistent.

358 I think we have a pretty average distribution here at the university and I can't think of any specifics to point to suggesting that our intellectual environment is exceptionally good or poor.

361 I found that at UA I can have conversations with many, but not all of peers without having to dumb down my terminology. I love being around other smart people. Also, in every other class there is one student who thinks he (yes it is always a he) knows more than the instructor and asks questions that go beyond the scope of the class and over most of the students heads. That student usually annoys most of the class, but at the same time for those of us who do to some degree understand what he is talking about, he challenges us to learn a little more.

362 I cannot provide you with concrete evidence in order to provide proof of my opinion. I just feel that while the intellectual environment does increase dramatically once in upper level courses, lower level course seem lacking.

363 I think "intellectual environment" is a convoluted phrase, and I'm sure that some at the university see UA as a place with a nice intellectual climate, but I'm afraid my answer in 6b details what leaves to be desired.

364 I think that, aside from the classes, people do not necessarily want to have intellectual conversations. In the classroom, it is a great intellectual atmosphere, but away from the classroom, most people take time to relax and not necessarily discuss items of deep intellectual nature. That is why I marked "average."

366 The classes that were small allowed me to realize how intelligent a lot of the students that come to UA are.

368 I have met many students who care absolutely nothing about going to class or learning and only wish to party like there's no tomorrow. I have had TA's in my chemistry classes who didn't care so much that we learned or understood what we were doing but more about just getting us to leave early so they can leave early as well. I have been to the CTL Center when I needed help on Calculus 3 and nobody there was able to help me understand the problems. I have seen students who care immeasurably more about our football team than about succeeding in their classes. I have taken many classes which have absolutely nothing to do with my future career aspirations of being an Air Force Pilot and have taken courses where the professors were absolutely dry as dust in their teaching style. I used to really like chemistry until I came here to the university. I have changed my major to Spanish because my professors and occasionally the material itself caused me to utterly hate chemistry and at times the sciences in general. I

369 As a transfer student from another 4 year institution, the professors here at UA were largely more helpful, more knowledgeable, and more interesting.

370 People seem to want to learn, most teachers are good at weeding out those who are just here to play. If a class room is full of people who want to learn, then WOW!!! Great things will happen.

371 I would characterize the intellectual environment at UA as strong because I felt challenged in all of my courses, but not too challenged; just above average.

373 When you take classes with teachers who love what they're teaching the classes are wonderful, but then you can have awful teachers.

374 I had the opportunity to take quite a few great classes in theatre that challenged me creatively and intellectually .

375 If it isn't about football, people seem not to care.

376 I am in American studies, New College, and Geography programs. All of these have very strong faculty who have pushed very hard for my entire education for me to be the best student possible. Many of the faculty members I have encountered in my real class

377 I've consistently felt that the campus environment was a place of acceptance, diversity, and cultural and intellectual stimulation.

379 My department allowed me to interact with people who specialize in different areas of academia.

380 Teachers give students the opportunity to think for themselves and the tools to form their own opinions even if they differ from the professors

381 I feel that being around my fellow students has increased my education.

385 There is a lot of variety on campus and plenty of opportunities to meet interesting people. Especially if you take honors courses you can discuss and become friends with very smart people!! I really enjoyed to mingle with people from other majors.

387 In the upper level courses, especially in my major, the students were very focused and the the instructors and teaching assistants were very professional.

388 All staff I have encountered are extremely knowledgeable, not simply in their particular subjects, but in many different fields.

389 There are no classes offered that prepared me for a career in my major and many times a core class is made incredibly difficult to "weed out" students. This causes a student to spend too much time preparing for these classes and does not allow time to fo

391 I went to a college prep school and overall I felt that I was more challenged there than I was here. And as for my major all it consisted of was history...there were no courses in what you can do with this for a job...administration purposes

392 I rarely feel challenged in a way other than needing to memorize things.

393 i really enjoyed the fact that for my major (sculpture) there is plenty of time to talk to someone for advice on a project or help in creation of a project. No excuse to not have anything done because the help is there.

394 The general populous of students attending this university are only interested in having a degree behind their name. Scholastic achievement and participating in intellectual conversation are not "requirements" for said degrees. Also, there are few teacher

395 The majority of my classmates carried themselves in a highly intellectual manner.

396 UA provides a very diverse learning environment by offering classes in many different areas of study that gives each student the opportunity to study anything they want. With all of the different classes and majors provided here comes a highly trained pr

400 During my enrollment at UA the intellectual environment has been consistent, consistently being an environment where stagnation is not tolerated, for if we do not embrace sensible change we would still be in the dark ages.

401 I don't feel like I've learned a lot here.

403 Football is a main part of this University and I feel that the University as a whole seems to care more about its athletics and athletes than its intellectual environment. Probably because the athletes bring in the money.

404 The standards for the University are high and I believe that is what makes the intellectual environment at UA so strong.

409 I think its strong because it offers an competitive environment

410 I feel there is ample opportunity for intellectual growth so long as the student is sincere in putting effort into his or her education. My own intellectual growth has been very great here at UA not only within my major (Biology), but also within the Hum

411 Overall I believe the University does a great job of creating an intellectual environment as a whole

413 I feel I have become very well rounded due to my four years at Alabama.

415 I was always impressed with my professors-especially in the upper level courses. All of them were passionate about their classes and cared that their students did well. I had no negative academic experience at UA in my upper level classes. (or required co

417 Tough classes but learned a lot.

418 Most everyone that I interacted with throughout my college career had a very strong intellectual mindset and were very focused.

420 I love UA. There are things that are lacking, but it is a fast-growing university and it is a great school to have gone to.

422 I just dont believe I could answer strong b/c I never had a teacher who was so involved or very interested in "pushing" me or wanting me to get into dental school.

423 Since my enrollment in the fall of 2004, The University of Alabama has put a higher emphasis on academics and recruiting to make the university a better intellectual environment.

425 The intellectual environment is great and it is strong but I would not put it as very strong because I'm sure there are colleges in the US with a stronger environment. I think the level is where it needs to be.

426 most people care more about football than academics.

427 There are many intelligent people at this school, but not everyone is here to learn.

428 Smart faculty, and for the most part smart, dedicated students.

432 might be better if it was more competitive to get in (just slightly higher standards so it would not be a back up school for students that can't get in elsewhere)

434 I learned more in her class than in any other classes. For some reason she made me want to learn, and I did not hate studying the material in her classes. She also really seemed to care about my education and future.

435 There are many faculty members and students in all different departments that really care about academics at the University to make it a strong intellectual environment. The reason I do not believe it is very strong is because of the focus on Greek partic

438 This is a great university and well-known nationally.

440 I have learned a lot in my communicative disorders department, and I have developed very close relationships with my teachers in that department, and that is why I feel like I have been in an intellectual environment.

443 The university strives to bring out the best in all of its students.

444 I felt that I learned a great deal while attending the university. However I felt that the faculty to student ratio could have often been smaller to get more student involvement.

446 Most classes encouraged students to critically think; however, a few were straight memorization with little in-class discussion.

447 Level of the classes

448 I feel that the majority of students on campus have been educated enough to carry on intelligent conversation regarding current issues. I feel comfortable in saying that our campus provides an intellectual environment that is free of restrictions to the s

449 There seem to be a lot of people here with little to no common sense. In my major courses, the intellectual environment is very strong, but in survey courses, that is not always the case.

450 I think there's a definite dichotomy of people who I would consider to be intellectual and people who just don't care. In A&S the environment is much better than in, say, the business school. But I think that's just the nature of the difference between

451 While being in chemistry and around people in my major, I felt the intellectual environment was extremely high. However, when I left my major for classes such as finance, I found the academic quality of students to be significantly lower.

453 In some classes it has been very hard to promote motivation to fellow students who are not concerned with the course work but with partying or other means. This semester has been the toughest due to this problem such as my group project where I am basical

454 The ability to be sucessful and the wililngness of students and faculty to help

455 Every school has some ignorant people; these people typically seem to speak their minds more often than others.

456 The intellectual environment is a product of the instructor. Overall the instructors had a vast knowledge of what they were teaching and where knowledgable about their subjects beyond the scope of the class.

457 na. Maybe this is reflectant upon my socialization.

458 To me it just like any other institution.

459 I have been somewhat disappointed with some of my professors, on more than one occasion I felt as if they didn't really care about being there, and spent more time pushing personal oppinion rather than teaching material.

461 The educational means and opportunities here at UA were strong and sufficient.

464 It just feels that way.

466 There are some very smart professors here who are doing some solid research and poor teaching. There are also some very talented and intelligent students.

467 My classes have provided me with excellent opportunities to get involved in class discussions and lectures. All of my professors take an active role in my success by helping me (and anyone else) whenever i ask for help and encouraging me to continue work

468 There is great diversity, furthering the intellectual environment.

469 Alabama is not necessarily known for their academics...it is known as a party school, which is exactly the kind of environment I have seen.

472 There are many intellectuals on this campus who have informed my education. However, there are also many individuals who are far from intellectuals, mainly undergraduates who do not desire to improve their intellect, but attend college for other reasons.

474 Well, in many of my 3-400 level courses I would have rated the intellectual environment as high. However, in most of my general ed and lower level English courses, I found that most of the people were much more interested in things other than learning any

475 This university cares more about diversity and money than about academic standards.

477 The majority of my English professors have led intellectual discussions. Though I pass many people who do not seem very smart, I have made many educated friends here.

478 If you're in the right crowd, then learning is important and not secondary.

479 Student wise, there are a lot of average intellectual people. I noticed with many of my classes with higher numbers of students, that most were not very interactive in class or not paying attention due to either cellular or laptop use. Participation was m

484 There are many different places a person can go to study; many libraries and computer labs.

485 While many schools and programs encourage intellectual pursuits on the individual level, many students who do not participate in schools where more creativity is required do not seem to share the same vigor for intellectual pursuits.

486 Two words: party school.

487 The environment in the Honors College and most upper division classes is challenging and encourages intellectual curiosity. However, the separation of honors students creates a kind of achievement gap that I find problematic to UA's overall atmosphere.

488 In my personal experience through the honors college and within my English and American Studies majors, I had a fabulous learning environment and thought-provoking professors and material. However, I don't think that this applies to all departments in th

489 I believe this university is centered around a few academic entities such as law, business, nursing, and education. If you are not a part of one of these departments support is very weak.

490 Depending on the college you are in, there are some who are very devoted to their learning and growing, while others are merely concerned with doing the bare minimum to pass so that they might graduate and get out.

491 I was able to participate in a stimulating intellectual environment through the UHP and CBHP here at UA. However, the few non-honors/non-major classes that I took were rather un-stimulating.

493 There are many opportunities to get internships and work with professors, as well as many chances for students to compete and present the research they work on.

494 The intellectual environment was very strong compared to the other University I attended for my core courses. I was impressed by the knowledge of the professors and students.

497 I've been in fields that were very strong. When I was an MIS major, I would characterize its environment as "very strong". However, I changed my major and I'd continue to say that other fields are strong, but not quite up to the level of the MIS program

498 I feel that the teachers I was in close contact with were all very knowledgeable and gave good advice.

499 Does this ask for the intellect of the instructors or students? They even each other out. Good teachers, dumb students.

500 The University, at least in my experience, is full of teachers who asked me to think and not just remember random factoids. That is the reason that I put very strong because even thought test scores in some instances may not be as high as I wanted I thoug

501 it is challenging and engaging. the teachers force you to think outside the box, to go that extra mile.

502 Classes are too large to rate as "very strong"

503 If you actually put yourself in the position to interact with the intellectual community you will find them inviting and fun people.

504 It is not as open and liberal as I believe a college campus should be, regardless of the region a college is in i feel like it should be a place where all ideas and opinions are open.

505 When one seeks intellectual stimulus on campus, it does not prove difficult to find. That said, the majority of students on campus are concerned with earning a degree rather than the actual learning behind said degree.

506 Most of my classmates did not take their educations very seriously. Most of the students were more concerned with their social lives than in schoolwork and learning opportunities.

507 Over four years, I came into contact with many different intellectual ideas on a variety of subjects.

508 Everyone I come into contact with is extremely bright, open-minded, and willing to discourse about almost anything.

509 I feel that there could be some improvements in the area of space available for quiet study and group study rooms.

510 There are some bright people at the University. But most students are only concerned about popularity and partying.

511 My department in particular allowed for a variety of discussions concerning topics that are important to this day. Nearly all of the professors in the history department contributed to the intellectual debate.

514 The professors obviously were intelligent, however, I often had less than intelligent students in my classes that contributed nothing to intellectual discussions

515 Many brilliant teachers, not many that cared about their students.

516 I feel that one can receive an excellent education here, but like all things, there could be improvements. The university could do a better job of insuring that all students have the academic support they need by encouraging professors to be academic ment

517 If you are proactive about your education, then you will get the best results. I do wish more students would realize that.

520 The University strives for its students to receive the best education possible and provides various avenues to achieve that education.

521 Course material is usually "dumbed down" and teachers often lecture as if the students are stupid. I know this is done to help those having trouble with the class, but most of those are people not willing to put in the effort. For the few that do try an

522 I don't see a lot of encouragement of student lead academic activities on the part of the administration.

523 The New College Program is my home, and the freedoms I was allowed there let me become who I am today. I'm thankful for that.

524 The University has a diversity of students from all of the country with knowledge beyond any other University

525 I've met and talked to a lot of people here. Some are well-educated, others dumb as a brick and (in my opinion) don't belong in college...but they're here. So I went with the middle.

526 As an academic institution, UA operates very well. There are a significant number of excellent teachers and a relatively low number of bad teachers. The university provides lots of opportunities for learning and personal growth that can be very benefi

527 I feel like more classes need to be modeled after New College classes where you are involved in your education and the class is not focused around 3 multiple choice tests. I feel like the seminar style classes provide you with more opportunities to be in

528 lots of intellectual people

530 Everything I was involved in was related to a learning environment.

531 Since I am a DE student, I really cannot draw any conclusions regarding the intellectual environment at UA.

532 UA and the entire staff have a passion for learning, helping students develop and go be a productive member of society

533 Everyone I came into contact with was professional, candid, and open to different views. I had a wonderful experience with UA Faculty

534 In my interactions with faculty members at UA, I felt they were engaging, open-minded intelligent people.

535 It is evident that the University strives to provide students with faculty that have various backgrounds in education, social experiences and diverse cultures.

536 It is a very well respected institution with high standards.

537 Everyone i have worked with have been extremely qualified.

540 It's the same as my answer for 6b. UA almost seems like a school for those who can't get into or survive anywhere else. Even the most careless student can easily make a B in their classes with minimal effort. The professor is just going to give them a goo

542 I was intellectually challenged in the classroom on a regular basis. I was taught to analyze my environment and culture in a way that I could not do before college.

543 The professors are very knowledgeable about the subjects they teach. Professors that find the subject interesting are easier to learn from because you can tell they have a passion for the subject.

544 All people in high positions seem to know their position or subject matter well.

548 It is very strong although I believe with some of my instructors were too smart to get on our level to teach.

551 their are many strong minded people at the university

552 As a student in the Honors College, I have been surrounded by highly intelligent students and faculty for four years. Having been to parties and living on the Strip, I have also encountered many students who contribute very little to the intellectual envi

554 I found this environment to be very stimulating and fulfilling.

555 The university has a wide range of majors and thus topics that can be discussed in both formal and causal settings.

556 Undergraduate research is strongly suggested to students in the hard sciences. As a researcher myself I found it helpful to understand how important asking questions and creating knowledge is when going into a graduate degree.

557 Professors that center courses on student discussion, students taught and encouraged to generalize skills and ideas to other areas of life, students who independently seek to do more to enhance their learning, number of field experts on faculty, opportuni

558 I could tell the staff were very knowledgeable, however in some of my core courses, I felt that they were incapable of teaching the material to students so that students could understand the concepts

559 Thorough and rigorous. Also, fairly competitive.

560 Many of my professors in my major were not effective teachers. The best professors in my major were Dr. Patrick Leclair and Dr. Allen B. Stern at UA and Dr. Renato Camata at UAB. The other professors did not care about the students understanding the mater

561 It was very strong in Blount, Physics, Chemistry, etc., but it seemed to majorly trail off into other areas.

563 Professors are more focused on their research than teaching and the university as a whole is more concerned with football and how much money it brings in.

565 I would say UA challenged me in ways I never expected. Not only are the classes interesting, but when you walk around campus, eat at the ferg, or sit in a computer lab people are discussing those very things they learned and applying the ideas. It is a be

566 The question said "all things considered," and I regard UA as an average state institution (from a national perspective). Now, I also think that there are plenty of opportunities to immerse yourself in a more intellectual environment by surrounding yours

568 Among students in general the emphasis on academic and intellectual pursuit does not seem to be a high priority. Learning for the sake of gaining knowledge is not high on many people's agendas--they just want to make their grades. For the most part, how

569 Generally, the professors whom I studied under in my upper level courses were genuinely interested in imparting knowledge and encouraging deeper analysis (especially in the PHL department). However, interaction among the students was more notable for foo

570 I wish I would have been given more opportunities to assist in research.

571 Great Faculty--Great Students. What more could you ask for?

572 Because I was provided 5 options and I chose the one that best matched how I felt at the time.

573 The opportunities for involvement in career-related areas was excellent and advantageous.

574 U of A is more based on a social scene I personally feel. Academic opportunities to go above and beyond are not very many.

575 I would have liked to have closer relationships with my individual professors, and I felt like the size of many of my classes did not permit me to do so.

576 It is a growing University allowing students from all different regions of the U.S. and backgrounds attend and share their knowledge through the institution.

578 I was usually satisfied with professors and material

580 I think that a lot of people on our campus have the ability to realize more of their potential if they were taught how to tolerate and discuss. It is a conservative campus that often does not welcome liberal ideals.

582 You can tell that each professor in every department cares about the curriculum of their course and wants to see you learn as much as possible.

583 Upper level professors try to actually get you to think for yourself.

584 Just listening to the conversations in the classroom and around campus you can tell that there is a higher level of intelligence here.

585 My professors were always interesting and seem to really understand their area of study.

588 I do not remember ever receiving an unexplained, uneducated response during a conversation with anyone while I have been here, including: peers, classmates, professors, employees, or really anyone for that matter (within the University boundaries).

590 People at UA are very intellectual, this is clear with all of the publications that our professors have.

591 While certain communities within The University foster the kind of intellectual discussion I would expect at an intellectual institution (e.g., Honors College, The Blackburn Institute, etc.), the general atmosphere towards intellectualism on this campus is

592 party school

594 When compared to the smaller institution I previously attended, UA has a similar intellectual environment. This leads me to believe that the environment is average.

595 I have never been somewhere that fosters the differences and growth of individuals as a collective class and as individuals.

596 UA has a reputation in the Southeast for having a strong academic environment.

600 I think that the University's ability to maintain a high level of intellectualism, despite the stereotypes of being a Southern university, is largely thanks to the faculty, especially in my department. Having faculty that are from all different parts of the

604 Too many big classes. Seminars by far the best learning experience

214 Most of the professors in the business dept. were excellent.

217 Most of the students who attend UA simply do so out of their ability to pay tuition. UA does not seem to want to revoke students despite the fact that they do not know how to think outside of high school memorization. Many students past the freshman experience seem to be unable to justify or express an argument tactfully or reasonably. 259 Most of my courses were not challenging.

261 I think it's really competitive, and drives you to excell.

263 Very strong, most professors knew the material that they were teaching and had their distinct styles in conveying it to their students

267 I feel that overall the intellectual environment at UA was strong for the most part.

269 The facilities are great (especially in the business school). There are always diverse groups of students walking around campus. There are all kinds of advertisements for seminars, speakers and other educational event around campus.

308 Great but not the best in the country

313 I was pushed to do more work and learn more facts and strategies about business in all my classes.

314 There were many professors I encountered that were only there for the short work hours, they could care less about what we learned.

315 As classes got higher the work load really got lighter.

316 Great learning atmosphere. Academic standards are high.

317 The intellectual environment is clearly clouded by everything else that is going on on campus, such as football, and other major events.

319 Comfortable in the class room with teachers that cared.

320 Every class, especially upper level, continuously provided ways to stimulate our thoughts to the fullest. We had many good, in-depth conversations and I learned a lot throughout the course of my time here.

321 The professors in your 300 and 400 level courses seem to really care about what they do because they have done this most of their lives. 472 *Most of the students that you interact with, both in class and out of, seem to be smart, intelligent, and capable people.*

Respondent Characteristics

One hundred and thirty-eight of 619 graduating students (22.3%) from the College of Education completed the instrument during the 2008-09 and 2009-10 academic years. One hundred and thirteen respondents were female (81.9%), and 25 were male. One hundred and twenty-four respondents were White (89.9%), 11 were African-American (8.0%), two were Hispanic (1.4%), and one was a non-resident Alien (0.7%). Fifty-five respondents graduated during the 2008-09 academic year, and 83 during the 2009-10 academic year.
